THE TOUR OF THE WINDOWS

The East Window
Shown twice on this page,
celebrates the four Gospels of the
New Testament.

The saints are Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, their names are given in latin.

In memory of Charlotte, wife of Rector James Croft, she died in 1825.

This Norman zig zag arch, built 1100 to 1150 AD, is the oldest part of the church. For 100 years it was the outside West door to the nave.

Then the belltower was added. The bellringers held the ground floor of the tower for 750 years. In 1874 they were moved, up to the first floor, given a separate turret staircase on the north side. The Vestry was made in the space, one bell rope still dangles into the room.

#### The Tour of the Windows

This is a keepsake to remind villagers and visitors of the epics they can see in full colour and in ever changing light.

The cast before you has 75 people, many being saints, 32 angels, 8 lions, 7 sheep, 4 doves, 2 gulls, a cow, a lamb, a serpent and a dragon.










This altar window in memory of S. Mary S. Deedes, 1914.



#### The Royal Coat of Arms of William IV


By W. Bailey, 1834. A splendid painting, included here among the stained glass as secular relief on the window tour.

#### The Croft Lights

The left window: the coat of arms of Archdeacon James Croft, Rector of Saltwood 1812 to 1869. The right window: the arms of his father in law, Charles Manners Sutton, Archbishop of Canterbury 1805 to 1828.
