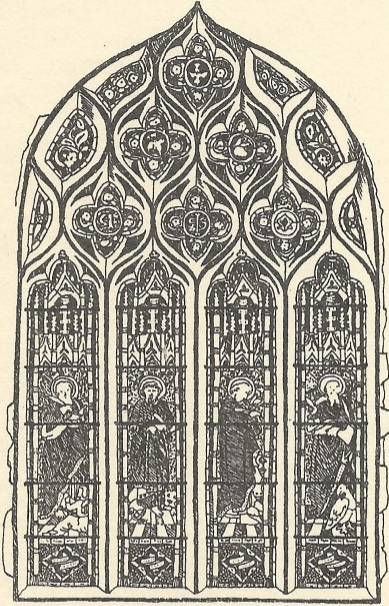

New Testament.

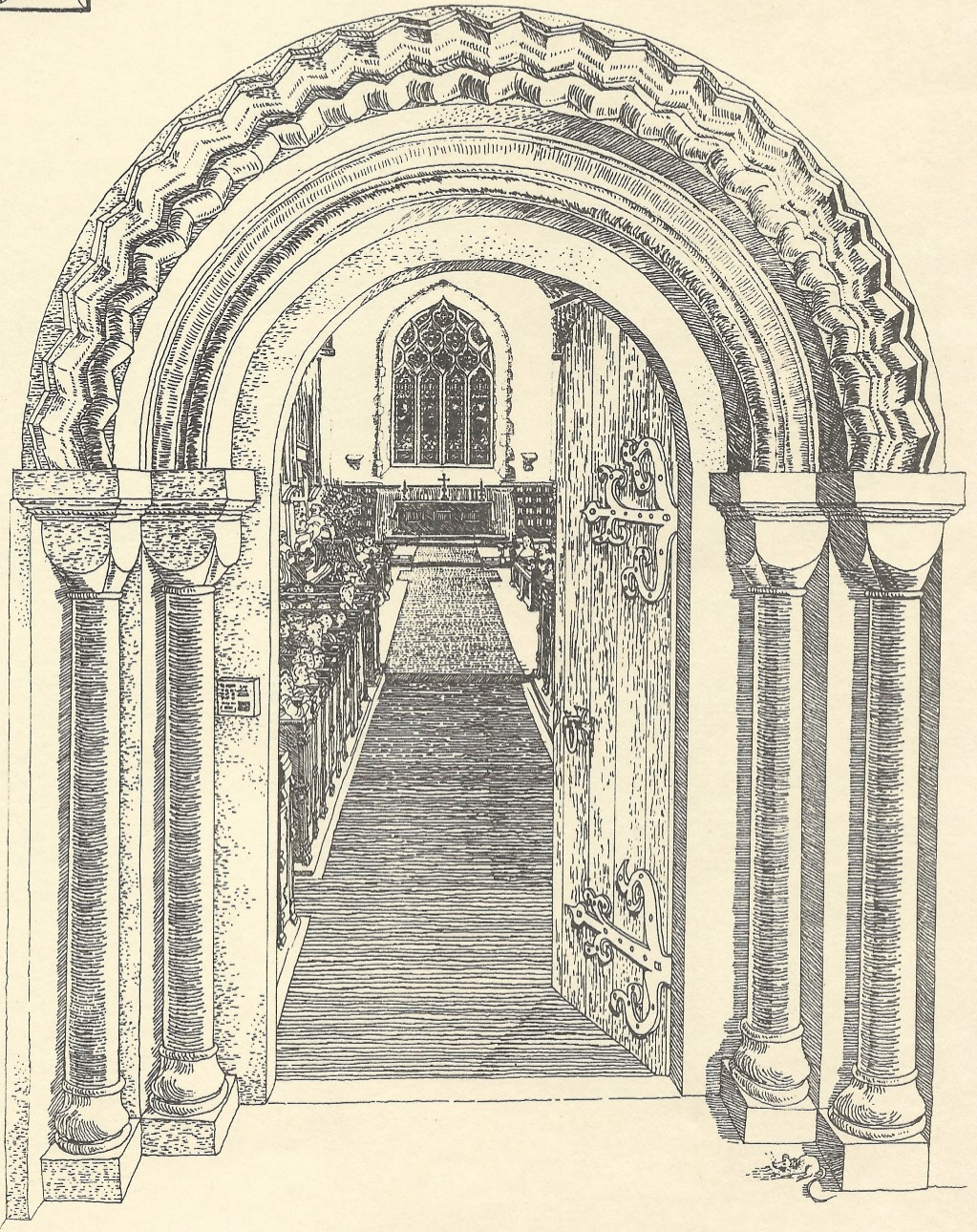
The saints are Matthew, Mark,

The Church Guides. The money raised from the sale of the guides is to go to the Saltwood Church Property Fund.



This Norman zig zag arch, built 1100 to 1150 AD, is the oldest part of the church. For 100 years it was the outside West door to the nave.

Then the belltower was added. The bellringers held the ground floor of the tower for 750 years. In 1874 they were moved, up to the first floor, given a separate turret staircase on the north side. The Vestry was made in the space, one bell rope still dangles into the room.

The Tour of the Windows

This is a keepsake to remind villagers and visitors of the epics they can see in full colour and in ever changing light.

The cast before you has 75 people, many being saints, 32 angels, 8 lions, 7 sheep, 4 doves, 2 gulls, a cow, a lamb, a serpent and a dragon.

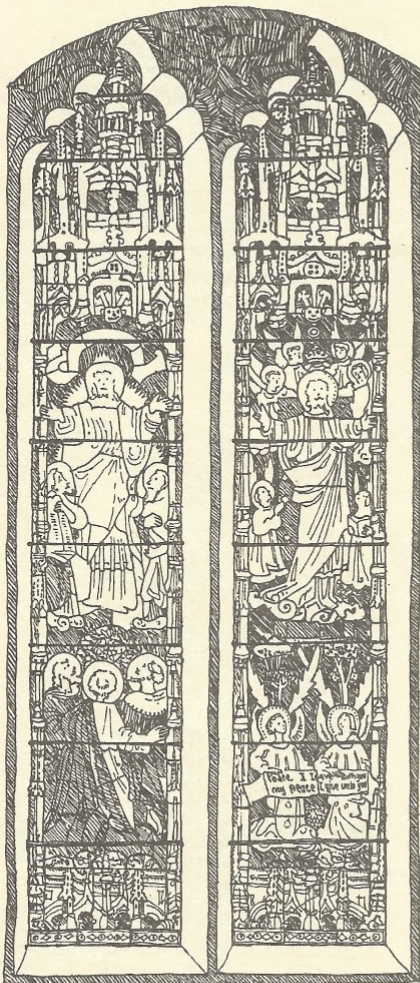

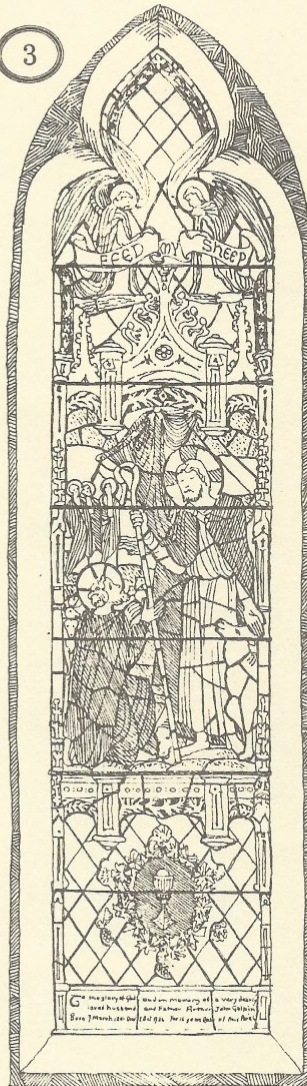

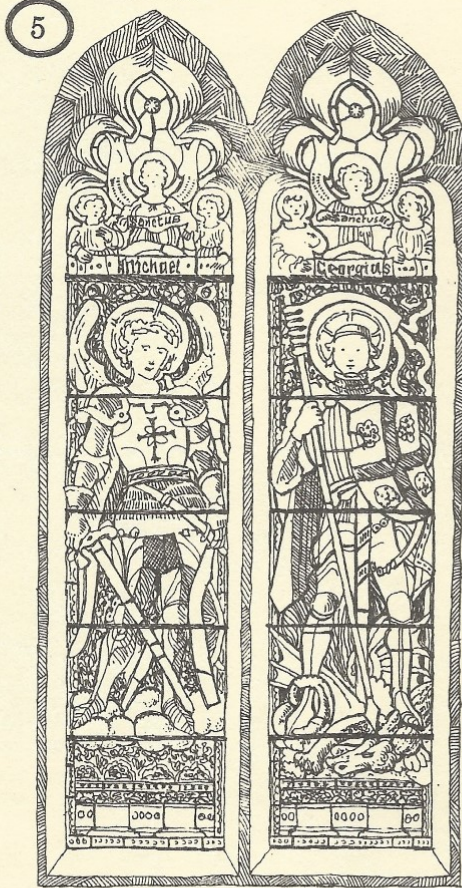
The Deedes Windows

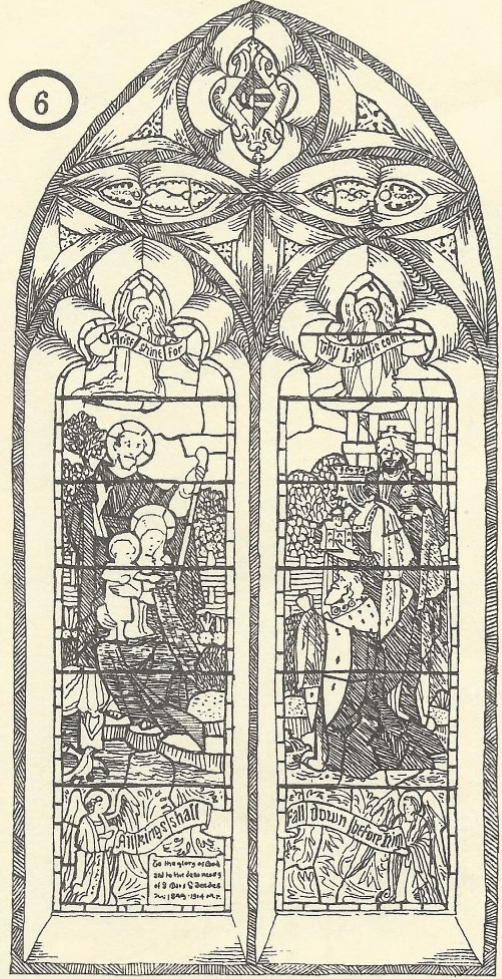

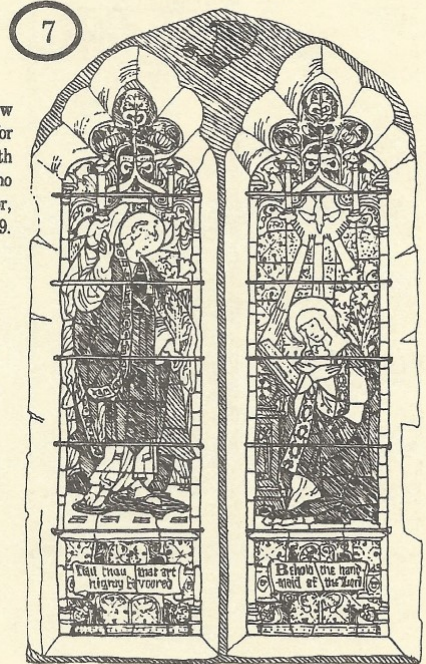

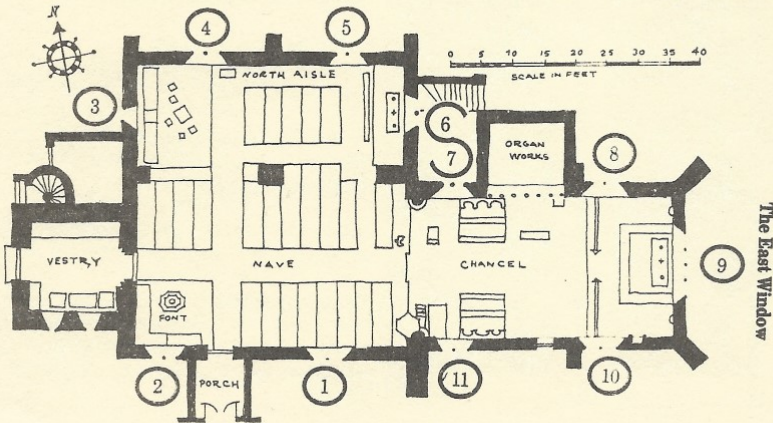

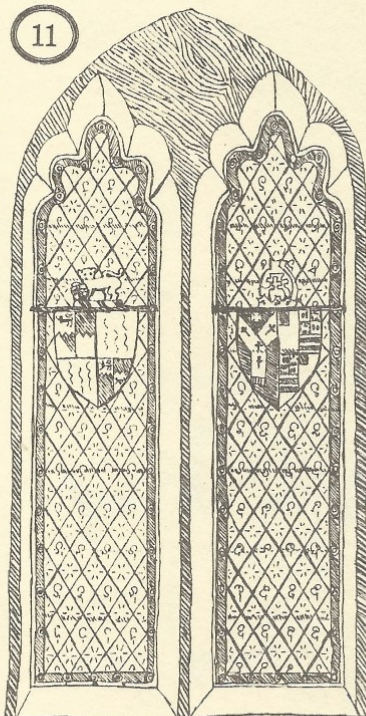

10am Parish Eucharist. 6pm summer,
4.30pm winter: Evensong and Address.

On first Sunday in the month:
9am Holy Communion at **Pedlinge Chapel**.
10am Morning Service.

On other Sundays in term time Sunday School meets in the **Lads' Club** at 9.50am
Wednesdays: 10am Holy Communion.
