
Map 10



Henry Albert Day was the son of Albert and Susannah Day who are buried in plot 572 After studying theology, he became a clergyman in the Church of England, at first in Camberwell, and was appointed Rector of Little Berkhampsted in 1908. Although he was in 1919 engaged to be married to Sarah Edith Rowling, the marriage did not take place. He died in Devon in 1951.

Inscription In memory of/the/ Rev. James Bell/who died Dec XXX MDCCCXXXIV

And of two of his children/ Julia/who died Sept XX MDCCCXVI/Edmund/ who died on II March MDCCCVIII

And of/ Mary/his wife/who died Jan. VI MDCCCX ILLEGIBLE

James Bell was inducted as vicar of Lympne in 1802. In retirement he lived in Hillside Road, Hythe. He died on 30 December 1834

Julia Harrison Bell was baptised in Hythe on 12 May 1806. She died on 20 September 1816. She was the couple's third daughter

Edmund Harrison Bell died in on 6 January 1808. He was the couple's only son.

Mary Bell nee Harrison married James Bell on 12 January 1799 in Hythe. The couple had five daughters and a son.

Plot 743 Stokes

Inscription Sacred/ to the memory of/ Jane wife of Edmund Stokes/ of this Parish/ who departed this life/ the 8th of September 1816/ aged [7]6 years/ She left surviving four daughters/ viz Jane, Elizabeth, Mary and Ann.

Also Edmund Stokes/ who departed this life/ the 8^{th} of [July] 1834 / aged 87 years.

Jane Stokes nee Rigden lived in Lyminge at the time of her marriage to Edmund Stokes on 27 October 1771. Their four daughters were all baptised there, Jane on 29 March 1772, Elizabeth on 16 April 1775, Mary on 16 August 1778 and Ann on 24 February 1782.

Edmund Stokes was baptised in Hawkinge on 31 May 1747, the son of Thomas & Mary Stokes. Edmund and Jane had probably moved to Hythe by 1801 when two of their daughters married there, Jane to William Sisson and Mary to Thomas Marshall (see plot 621). Their other two daughters married in Hythe in 1804, Elizabeth to William Shipwash and Ann to William Marshall. Elizabeth is buried in plot 729.

Inscription This stone/is erected to perpetuate the/illegible remembrance of/Harriett/wife of Richard Oxley/illegible late of Horsmonden/in this county/who departed this life September/17th illegible aged 37 years

The deceased was greatly/illegible by her family and a large circle of friends

Also Emma daughter of the above/ who died illegible

Harriet Oxley nee Hammond married Richard Oxley on 20 February 1839 in Horsmonden. He was a grocer and draper. Shortly after the birth of their son in 1840, they moved to Hythe, where Richard had premises in the High Street., and where Harriett died in 1844

Emma Oxley born on 11 August 1841, in Horsmonden, the second child of Richard and Harriet Oxley. She died in Hythe in Jun 1845, aged three years.
